









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## **Non-Endowment Contributions**



**Fiscal Year** 










## Impact on Student Success










# **Graduation Numbers**

- •Our 4th record year in the last 5 years










# **High Impact Practices**

> **Core concept:** "El Puente" (The Bridge)










# **BAS - Emergency Services Administration**

- Program starts in August, 2018







# **Cyber Security**




# **Certified Dietary Manager**
