
This session is for all who want to teach or conduct meetings using 21st-century tools. Using WebEx as a meeting platform minimizes scheduling issues and increases attendance by facilitating participation from anywhere there is an Internet connection. This also helps PPCC in its sustainability efforts by reducing our carbon footprint through fewer trips between campuses. As a classroom tool, WebEx provides a way to improve learning and retention through recorded lectures and classroom activities that can be posted in D2L for review by students and through allowing real-time, face-to-face access for students who, due to disabilities, transportation issues, or weather, cannot make it to campus for class time or office hours.
